### From the Co-presidents

Dear Friends,

We are excited to bring you the Whiskers 2023 Annual Report and share an overview of the past year.

Through the hard work of more than 100 dedicated volunteers, Whiskers touched the lives of more than 500 cats and kittens in 2023. We provided sanctuary to cats and kittens, helped them heal, nurtured and loved them, and prepared them for adoption into loving homes.

What makes Whiskers different - and what we love so much about Whiskers - is our mission of welcoming all cats and kittens. We take in older and sick cats, cats who have been injured or abused, FIV+ or FeLV+ cats, and every sort of homeless, abandoned or stray cat. Many of our rescued cats would not be considered adoptable by other shelters, but Whiskers is proud to give these cats sanctuary for as long as needed. We always are so delighted when these cats, too, eventually find their forever homes.

Last year was not without its challenges. First and foremost, we lost our beloved President, Carol Hall, who has been the standard-bearer of Whiskers' mission for so many years. Carol's dedication to saving the lives of cats and kittens was unparalleled, and she inspired and mentored so many others in the rescue world who will strive to carry on her good work. The other major challenge facing Whiskers stems from a new law known as the Companion Animal Care Standards Act for Shelters and Rescues that takes effect in December 2025. To comply with the Act's new standards for animal shelters, including a limit of 12 cats per room, Whiskers needs a larger and more modern shelter facility. This is a very costly initiative, but one that is essential for Whiskers to continue its vital mission of providing sanctuary to cats and kittens in our community. Whiskers Animal Benevolent League is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization registered with the New York State Charities Registration Bureau. We are Registered Rescue #RR-304 with New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets. We are a small, all volunteer-run, no-kill animal shelter in Albany, New York. Here at Whiskers we believe every life is meaningful and worth saving. We go the extra mile to do whatever it takes to make each cat and kitten's life we commit to, be the best it can be. Every cat and kitten we take in gets Whiskers' lifetime pledge to be there for them for their entire lives if need be.



Our mission is to provide abandoned, abused, and stray animals with a place of comfort, safety, and health and ultimately find them loving, responsible, permanent homes. We specialize in helping animals that have no advocate, those that have been abandoned on the streets or who have been abused. Secondly, we seek to reduce the population of unwanted companion animals by arranging for their spay/neutering prior to their adoption. Finally, we seek to provide information to the public on how to better provide for and enjoy their companion animals.

## In Memory of Carol Hall

Whiskers volunteers were saddened by the sudden, unexpected death of our long-time Whiskers President, Carol Hall, in 2023.

For more than two decades, Carol Hall was the face, heart and soul of Whiskers Animal Benevolent League. She dedicated herself to everything from feeding kittens that needed to be bottle-fed every few hours to the intensive care needed by the oldest and most fragile cats that found their way to Whiskers.

Carol came to Whiskers to heal her heart, by working with cats, after one of her own cherished cats passed away. At that time, Whiskers was based in a series of thrift shops throughout Albany. She was part of the effort to move the rescue into a house on Second St. in Albany, and later into its current building in Albany, in 2000. Over time, with Carol's efforts, Whiskers extended its reach and was able to help thousands of cats more efficiently.

While it is hard for most of us to imagine Carol as anything other than a devoted Whiskers volunteer and inspiring rescue leader, she attended Albany College of Pharmacy, worked as a programmer for New York State Police, and raised a family. She was a voracious reader and a lover of all things Gaelic. Carol was a quilter, and many times she donated her exquisite quilts to Whiskers fundraising auctions, to raise money to help save abandoned and injured cats, and kittens, and pay the ensuing bills.



Working from her home, Carol wrote fundraising letters and fielded thousands of phone calls and emails from volunteers and people in need of counsel and assistance. She came up with creative themes for big Whiskers events. A favorite of many, during a presidential election year, was the "Purresidential Election." Shelter cats were nominated for president and vice president, and then battled it out with votes from fundraiser attendees to claim the titles. The campaign was fun to follow through email, Facebook, and posters at the shelter.

The energy of Carol Hall will live on through Whiskers for many years to come. Her work will be carried on by many volunteers. Carol, we thank you for your time, your spirit, your creativity, and skills. Whiskers would not be the organization it is today, without your work.


